

Georgia Numismatic Association 2010 Coin Show Exhibits Rules

1. All exhibitors must be members of the Georgia Numismatic Association. Nonmembers may join prior to the show by contacting the Membership Secretary:

2. The exhibitor must prepare all displays, but in extenuating circumstances the exhibit may be set up by a designated representative.
3. Do not identify the exhibitor in the display. All material displayed must be the property of the exhibitor and must be placed in the display cases. *Fire regulations prohibit placement of any materials in the aisles.*
4. Any material known to be a copy or replica must be labeled as such. If exhibitors intend to display reproductions of U. S. coins or currency, they are cautioned to adhere to applicable laws and regulations. More information can be found on the following web site: <http://ustreas.gov>. 5. Exhibits may be set up from 4:30 to 8:00 p.m. on Thursday (dealer set-up day) or on Friday/Saturday, starting at 8:30 a.m. Senior exhibits must be in place by 12:00 noon on Friday (Juniors by 10:00 a.m. on Saturday) in order to qualify for awards. Exhibits may not be removed from cases before 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, unless special permission is obtained from the Exhibits Manager. The bourse closes at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday. Exhibits shall be removed by 4:00 p.m.
6. Exhibit Applications must be postmarked by March 15, 2010. There are a limited number of exhibit cases and tables; therefore applications will be accepted in the order they are received. Those who submit Exhibit Applications will be notified of their acceptance by the Exhibits Manager, after the deadline has passed.
7. Exhibit cases will be furnished (at no cost) upon request; however exhibitors may furnish their own cases. Standard cases are approximately 20 3/4" x 32 3/4" on the inside.
8. Exhibitors may enter multiple exhibits. There shall normally be no more than ten total cases per exhibitor, regardless of whether or not the exhibitor supplies the cases. It may be necessary for the Exhibits Manager to limit the number of exhibits or to reduce the number of cases per exhibit, depending on the number of Exhibit Applications received. In the event that extra cases are available, the Exhibits Manager may grant special permission, on a case-by-case basis, to exceed the ten case limit.
9. Senior exhibits will be judged for Senior 1st Place, 2nd Place, and 3rd Place. Junior exhibits will be judged for Junior 1st Place, 2nd Place, and 3rd Place. Juniors are defined as those age 17 and younger, as of the opening day of the show.
10. Exhibitors will be provided a name badge that will provide access to the bourse area, including during dealer set-up hours.
11. The Exhibits Manager is ineligible to exhibit competitively. All other members of the GNA Board of Directors and members of the Show Committee are eligible to exhibit competitively. The Exhibits Manager may display a noncompetitive exhibit.
12. An exhibit that has previously won a GNA First Place award can be competitively entered again only if the display has been changed substantially; otherwise it may be entered only as a noncompetitive exhibit.
13. The decision of the Judges is final.
14. The Show Committee has contracted for 24-hour, professional bourse floor security, but all exhibits are displayed at the risk of the owner.
